

Eligibility – NSW PPP Existing Workers 2009/10

- Must not be enrolled in other secondary or tertiary education and training
- Must be and Australian citizen, permanent resident or Humanitarian refugee (sign a declaration to that effect)
- Be an employed NSW resident and work in NSW
- May have undertaken or completed other training programs, as long as not currently involved in those programs
- Must have worked at least one hour in the week before starting training

Fee exemptions

Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander students are exempt from paying the NSW fee.

Students in receipt of a Disability Support Pension and students with a disability (clients of a Teacher/Consultant) are entitled to one full fee exemption for one NSW course per year, and are eligible for the \$50 Concession fee for subsequent enrolments in that year.

Concessions

Students who receive a Commonwealth benefit or allowance (see list below) are eligible to pay a Concession fee of \$50 per course enrolment per year rather than the full NSW fee.

Note: A student who is recognised as a dependent child, spouse or partner of a recipient of an eligible benefit or allowance may also be eligible for the Concession fee.

To find out if you are eligible for a full-fee exemption or Concession fee, contact your campus before applying. Your campus can also advise you about what documentation you will need to bring with you to apply.
